

Using the My Health Record System: For Allied Health Professionals

The national My Health Record system, driven by the Australian Digital Health Agency, is an electronic summary of an individual's health information. It can be securely shared online between the individual and their healthcare providers involved, and improve patient health outcomes.

In 2018, the My Health Record is moving to an opt-out model, which means all Australians will have a record by the end of 2018, unless they choose not to have one. These information sessions will introduce the My Health Record system and explore its features and benefits for allied health professionals. These sessions will involve case-study discussions demonstrating how the My Health Record may improve communications between healthcare providers and contribute to improved patient care.
