Quality improvement activity – increasing cervical screening rates in your practice (QIM 9)

Cancer screening is a valuable health intervention against cervical cancer, however, it has relatively low rates of uptake. During the pandemic, the number of eligible women being screened for cervical cancer has decreased.

Hear from the National Cancer Screening Register about how to access your patients screening status and cervical screening histories electronically, directly through your clinical information system.

This session is focused on:

- how to implement a cervical screening quality improvement activity (Quality Improvement Measure 9 cervical screening - the number of female patients who are aged 25-74 years who have not had a hysterectomy and who have had a cervical screening test within the previous five years (HPV)
- use POLAR to assist you in increasing the cervical screening rates in your practice
- tracking your progress using POLAR data
- practice resources.
