For GPs and Specialists

The national My Health Record system, driven by the Australian Digital Health Agency, is an electronic summary of an individual's health information. It can be securely shared online between the individual and their healthcare providers involved, and may improve patient health outcomes.


In 2018, the My Health Record is moving to an opt-out model, which means all Australians will have a record by the end of 2018, unless they choose not to have one.


