

Online networking forum

For Practice Managers and Practice Nurses

Eastern Melbourne PHN (EMPHN) are able to support practice staff more effectively by providing an online networking forum for practice managers and nurses to network.

The Basecamp™ platform operates as a forum for discussion including additional features such as document posting with an EMPHN General Practice Support Officer responsible for facilitating and moderating the discussion.

The real-time discussions give practice managers and nurses a sense of community and the opportunity to participate in open, honest and constructive exchange without leaving their workplaces. All forum members can participate at the level of their choice and are notified by email of new posts. Practices of varying size, demographics and specialisation are represented in the one space—members can ask questions and receive quick responses from colleagues who have both similar and contrasting experiences.

Access to this forum is via registration. There is no cost to participate in this forum. Once registered you can log on from any workstation, mobile device or tablet by using your username and password which you set.

An email is sent to notify you when a new discussion or comment has been posted. You then have the opportunity to contribute to the discussion. Information posted remains available for future reference and can be viewed by all users.

Participation guidelines & Terms of use

Welcome to the online discussion space for Eastern Melbourne PHN (EMPHN). We encourage you to respond and contribute to the discussions hosted here. However, we do ask that by becoming a member and taking part you adhere to the following guidelines for participation.

- 1. Be polite, courteous and respectful of others.** Constructive criticism can be very useful but there's no need to make people feel uncomfortable or post comments that are likely to offend.
- 2. Check your facts.** If you are unsure if what you are writing is the truth, please don't represent it as such. And if it's just your opinion, make sure that you say so.
- 3. Don't post copyrighted content without permission.** Only post content if you have the right to do so.
- 4. Give credit where credit is due.** If you are talking about someone else's ideas, make sure you credit them.
- 5. Only post relevant links.** Always check that your links are to legitimate websites and are appropriate to the discussion.
- 6. Don't post obscene, racist, hateful, or objectionable content.** If you do we'll remove it. But what's worse, we might remove you from the conversation all together.
- 7. Private means private.** Do not reveal personal, private or identifiable information (e.g. tattoo/s, appearance, and culture/ethnicity) about yourself or others, this includes patient details.
- 8. You may not like everything you see.** Everyone participates differently and you may sometimes see things you don't like. You are welcome to disagree with others provided your tone is respectful. If you have a strong issue with any content that has been posted, please contact us.
- 9. Be understanding.** Everyone has different ideas/views. Be open to hear these differences and respond constructively.
- 10. Don't expect members to read between the lines.** It's sometimes hard to express subtleties in writing. Remember that other readers might not perceive the intended tone of your writing and take offense. So try to keep it simple and to the point.
- 11. No advertising of events/services.** This includes those within and external to your practice. If you have something you wish to advertise, email your moderator who will forward your request to the communication team for consideration in EMPHN's Practice News. This will allow information to reach a greater share of practices.
