

Using the My Health Record system

For Community Health Organisations

Eastern Melbourne PHN (EMPHN) invites you to an interactive event for community Health Organisations, focusing on the expansion of the national My Health Record system. A significant proportion of healthcare providers within the EMPHN catchment are connected and utilising the My Health Record features to provide effective and efficient care to their clients.

The national My Health Record system, driven by the Australian Digital Health Agency, is an electronic summary of an individual's health information. It can be securely shared online between the individual and their healthcare providers involved, and improve patient health outcomes.

On 16 July 2018, the My Health Record is moving to an opt-out model, which means all Australians will have a record by the end of 2018, unless they choose not to have one. This information session will introduce the My Health Record system and explore its features and benefits for Community Health.

Presented by Vandana Chandnani from the Australian Digital Health Agency, this workshop will:

- List the features and benefits of the My Health Record system for community health organisations
- Explain the privacy and security measures taken to protect the My Health Record system
- Communicate the benefits of the My Health Record system for consumers
- Describe how comprehensive health information (accessed via the My Health Record) can contribute to patient care.
