The Victorian Medicines and Poisons Regulations released **Public Health Emergency Order** #4 (**PHEO** #4) which amends legislation to enable the legal dispensing of Schedule 4 medicines from a digital image transmitted electronically. There are limitations and requirements to maintain accountability and safety for patients. The order is **in place until 27 March 2021**.

Note: Schedule 8 and Schedule 4 drugs of dependence (benzodiazepines, anabolic steroids, phentermine) are not covered by these amendments Key requirements
