Infection Prevention and Control for General Practice - Ringwood

For Practice Staff

Effective infection prevention and control is central to providing high quality health care for patients and a safe working environment for those that work in any healthcare setting. Practices are required to have a staff member designated as the leader in managing the infection control processes in the practice. This training will give staff undertaking this role information and resources to confidently carry out this responsibility.

Event overview

Having an infection control program is a requirement for accreditation for health care facilities, this introductory session will cover a range of topics to assist staff undertaking the responsibility for preventing and controlling infection in their practice.

Learning outcomes

- Explain the principles of infection control and chain of infection
- Define standard and transmission-based precautions and their use in general practice
- Recognise the importance of the use of personal protective equipment in prevention of transmission of infection
- Describe the role of hand hygiene, cleaning of the environment, sharps and spills management and staff immunisation in an infection prevention and control program
- Understand the steps required to comply with the RACGP Accreditation standards that relate to infection prevention and control.
