

Pathways for COVID-19 positive patients – East, North East and South East Melbourne

DHHS and Safer Care Victoria (SCV) have worked with the health sector and clinical leaders to develop comprehensive and consistent COVID-19 +ve care pathways for all Victorians who receive a COVID-19 +ve diagnosis.

In particular, the pathways will provide additional support to low risk COVID-19 +ve patients and their treating GP.

This document provides an overview of the pathway and the support East Melbourne Primary Health Network (EMPHN) can provide to general practices.

The pathway is designed to provide safe, high quality care, including community-based care for low risk COVID-19 positive patients, with escalation mechanisms to higher levels of care if required.

DHHS provides daily notifications of COVID-19 +ve patients to major Hospitals.

The hospitals in partnership with community health services will be contacting, consenting and enrolling patients into the pathway and performing a primary assessment.

The assessment process will allocate patients into a low, medium or high risk category.

Low risk clients will be referred to General Practice for management, medium and high risk clients will be managed by the Hospitals.

General practitioners will receive communication from the LHN or Community Health requesting involvement in managing their own low risk COVID-19 +ve patients. EMPHN will also be advised of the practices in the catchment with positive cases. EMPHN will not receive patient details at any stage.

Once notified, a practice facilitator will contact your practice to provide support on the model, including how to access health pathways, use of MBS items, support on data collection and transfer. This information sheet provides you with an overview of resources that will assist practices involved in the model.

Depending on the volume of cases in your practice you may decide to allocate a nurse to act as coordinator for these patients, or to set up a reminder system to manage the call schedule. The EMPHN practice support team can assist with setting this up.
