Transitioned AOD Programs

Family Alcohol and Drug Service (Anglicare)

• Support for families, a therapeutic treatment option for parents and other family members impacted by problematic substance use

Family Focus Project (EACH, as lead agency)

 A service provided through the EDAS consortium (EACH, Access Health and Community, Link Health and Community) delivering individual and family counselling for communities effected by problematic substance abuse.

Dual Diagnosis Program (Anglicare)

• Direct service delivery for individuals and their families impacted by issues relating to dual diagnosis in both a counselling and case management capacity.

Project HOPE (EACH – Knox)

 Project HOPE provides integrated care for people with AOD and co-occurring issues utilising a peer-led recovery approach to individuals and families where there is a co-occurring mental health and substance use concern

THRIVE (EACH – Knox)

• Provides assessment, consultation and counselling treatment for individuals and significant others where there is a substance use concern and/or co-occurring mental health concern.

Note: Project HOPE and THRIVE have been combined into one project

Yarra Ranges Youth Project (EACH)

• Provides outreach support to young people and their families who live in the Yarra Ranges

AOD RELATE (Banyule Community Health)

 Co-located in Banyule CH's GP clinic in West Heidelberg providing therapeutic services for individuals and their families impacted by issues relating to dual diagnosis in both a counselling and case management capacity

Eastern Home Based Withdrawal (YSAS)

• Support young people's recovery from problematic substance use by providing an effective alcohol or drug withdrawal service in the community

CALD capacity building project (Link Health and Community)

• Supporting people from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds, specifically targeting the Chinese community's access to AOD treatment services
