



# Fact Sheet - New mental health clinics to support Victorians during the COVID-19 pandemic

14/09/2020

- From Monday 14 September 2020, Victorians will have access to additional mental health support with 15 new HeadtoHelp mental health clinics opening to the public.
- These HeadtoHelp clinics are a free service, and for the next 12 months, will
  provide additional capacity within the existing mental health system, improving
  accessibility for Victorians who need support.
- People can access the *HeadtoHelp* services by attending in-person at a clinic near them or by phoning 1800 595 212\* to talk a mental health professional about their needs.
- You do not need a referral from your GP or other health professional to visit the HeadtoHelp service. However, your general practitioner may arrange for you to seek services through these clinics depending on your mental health needs.
- The clinics are staffed by a multi-disciplinary team of mental health professionals which include a combination of GPs, mental health nurses, a psychologist or a psychiatrist, social workers or other allied health workers depending on community needs.
- The clinics will operate in a COVID-19 safe environment and provide services either in-person or via telehealth where it is clinically appropriate to do so.

- Speaking to your GP about accessing Medicare-subsidised mental health services. Telehealth has been made available, so you can have an appointment from home via telephone or video.
- Reaching out to the Coronavirus Mental Wellbeing Support Service on 1800 512 348 or at <u>coronavirus.beyondblue.org.au</u>. This service is specifically designed to help people get through the COVID-19 pandemic. It's available in languages other than English.
