The Mental Health & AOD Integrated Care Pilot was funded by EMPHN to demonstrate how service integration can be implemented in healthcare organisations providing services to clients with cooccurring mental health and AOD needs.

The project is a response to a recommendation in the Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health System.

The project implemented the Continuous Comprehensive Integrated System of Care (CCISC) model, endorsed by EMPHN, Department of Health and Victorian Alcohol and Drug Association (VAADA).
